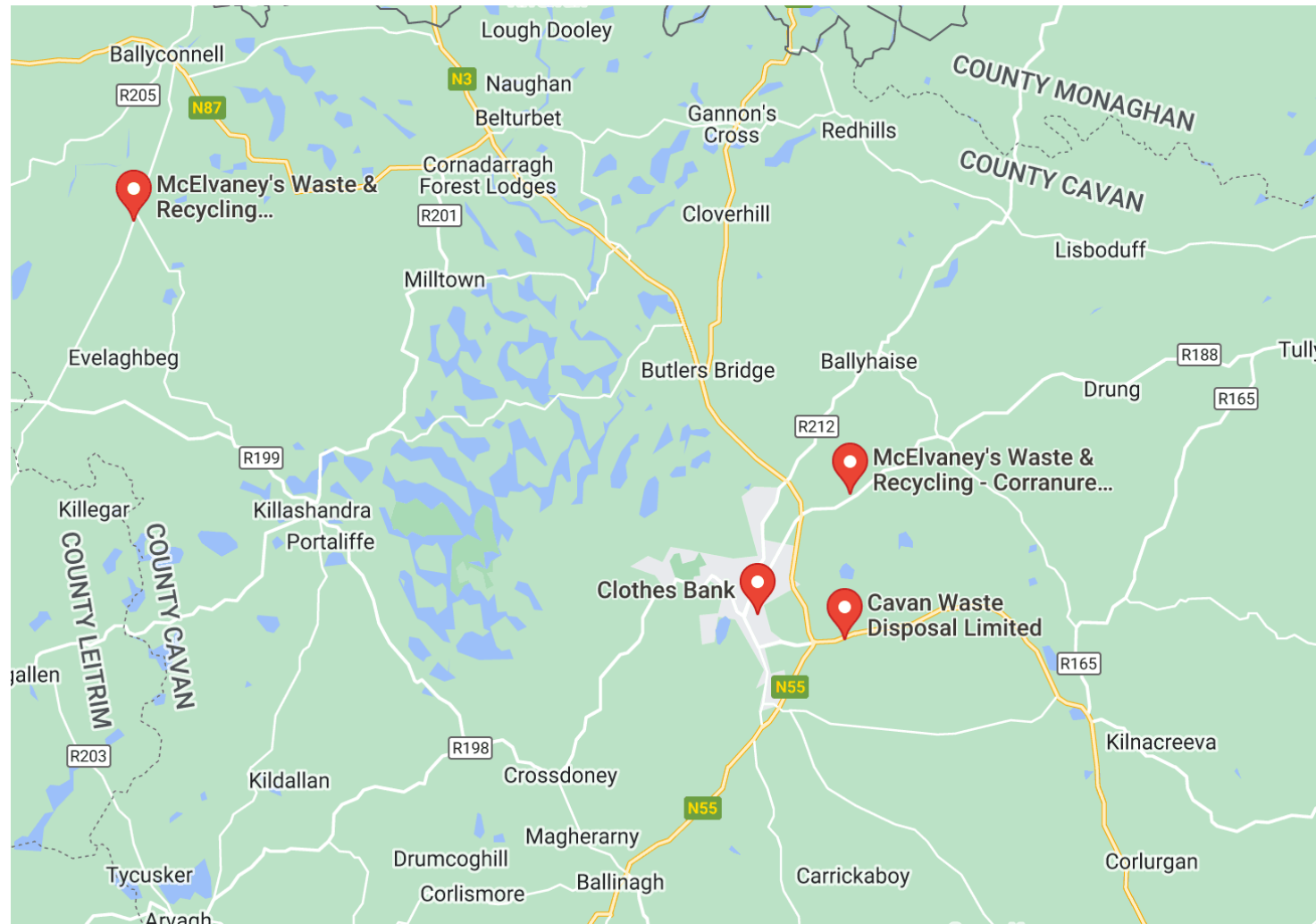

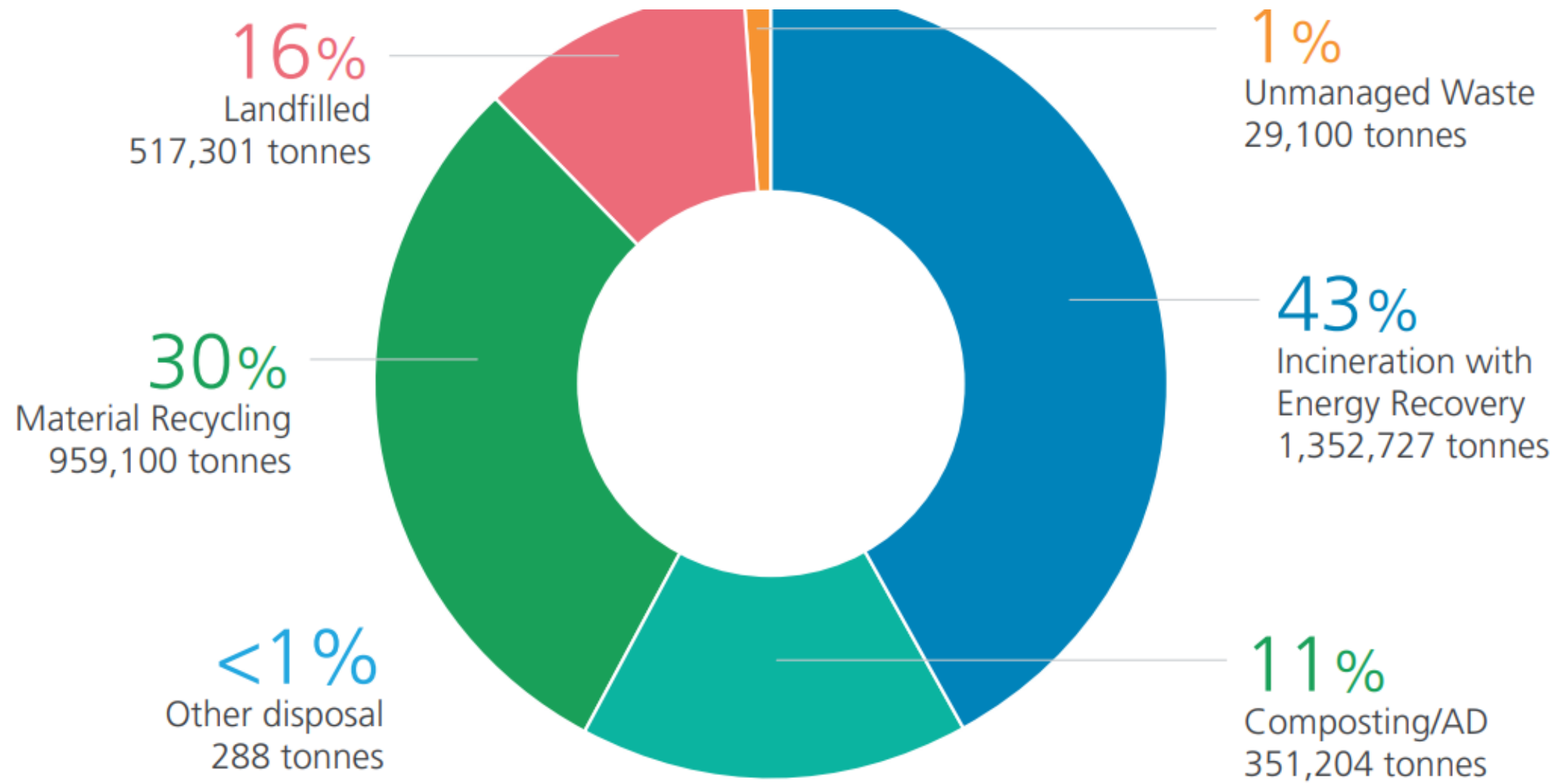

Wire gabions (cages)

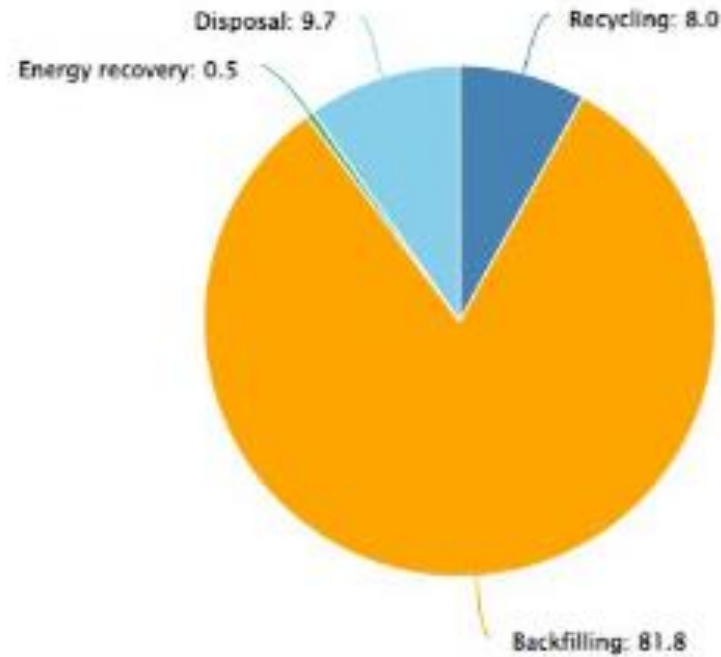


The advantages of using recycled concrete/ aggregates are:

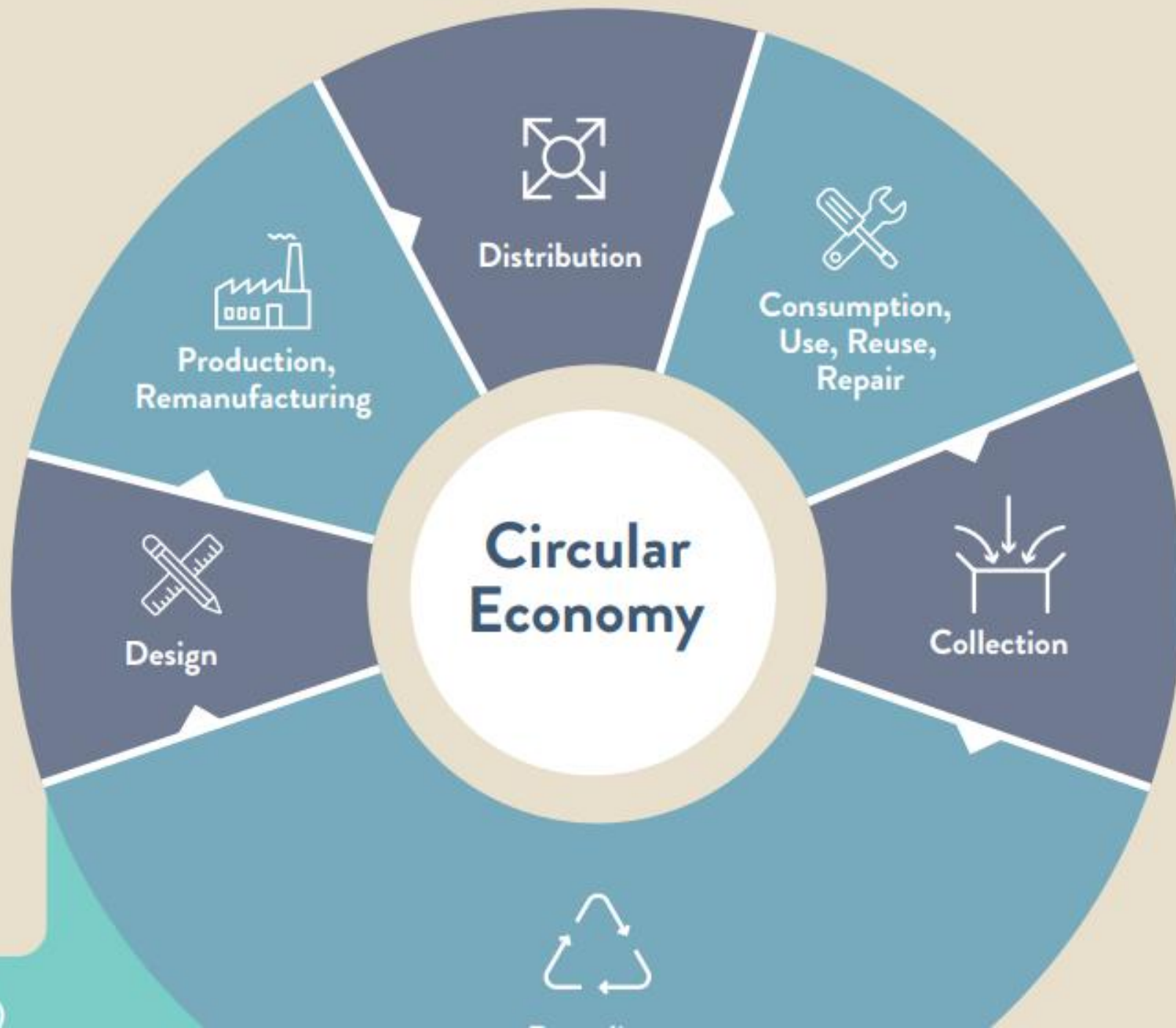

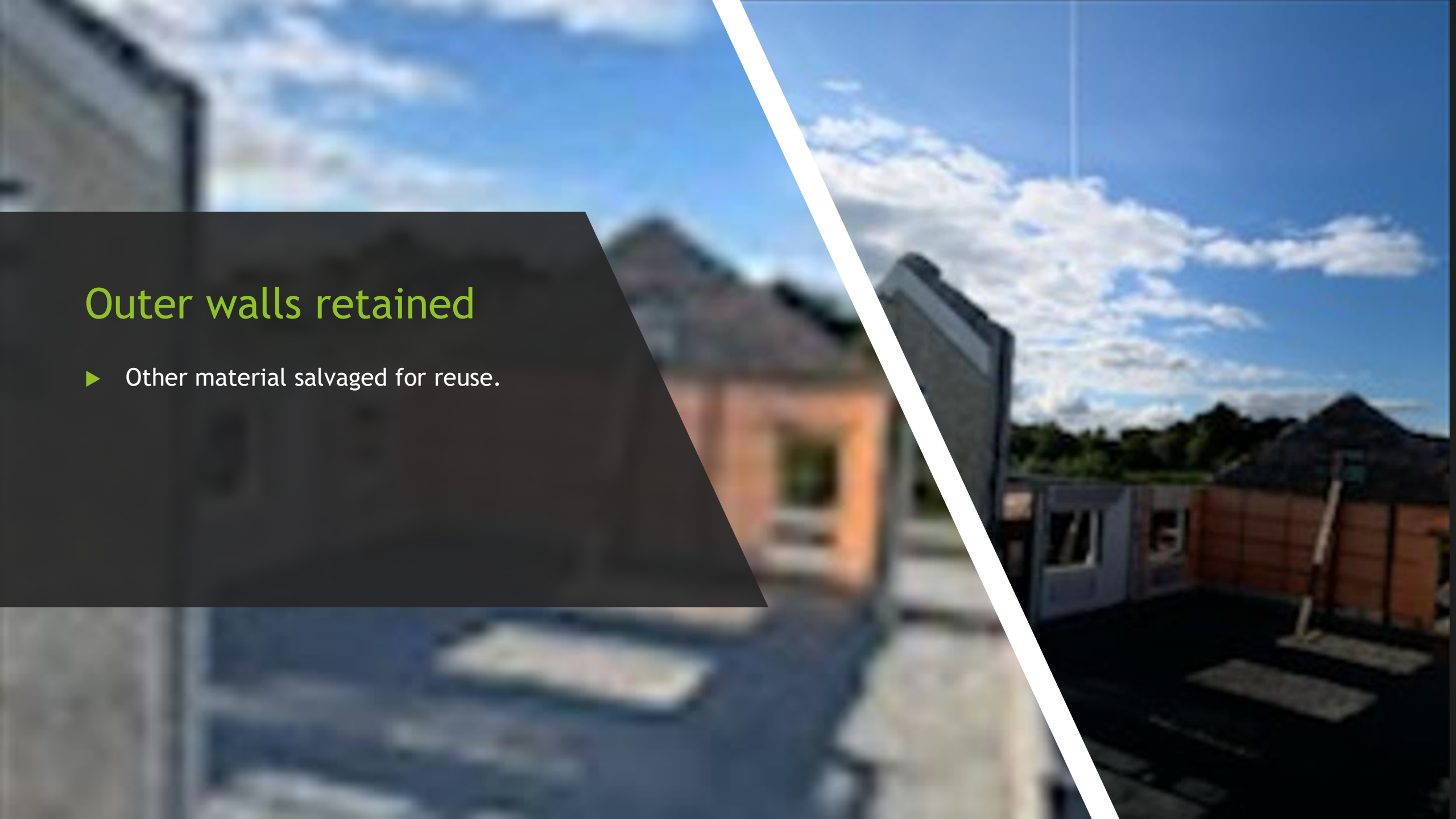
